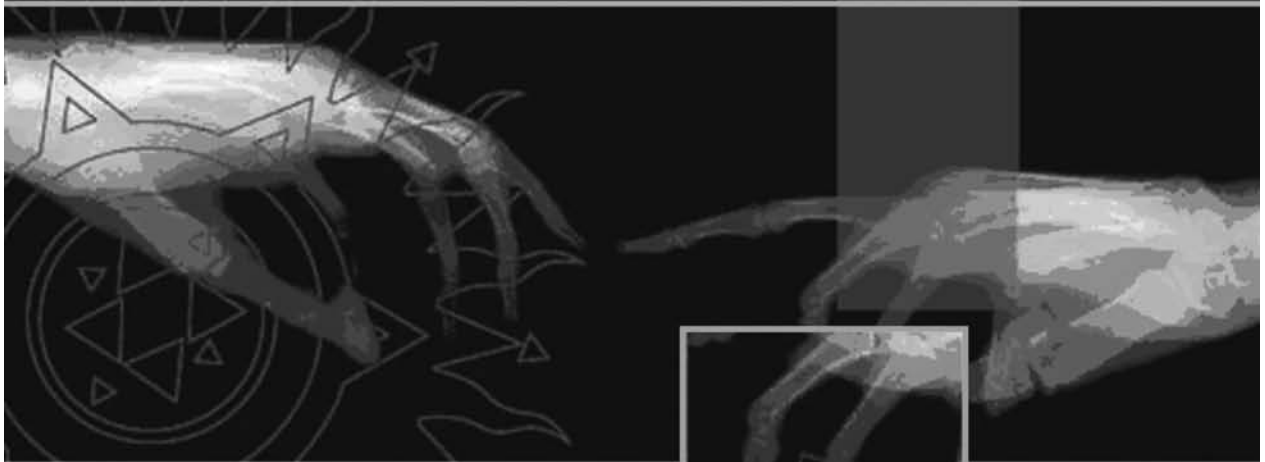
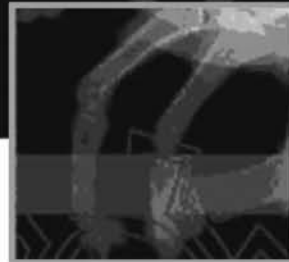

CALL FOR PAPERS/POSTERS (Online Only)

1. Interested persons who would like to present oral or poster presentations are invited to submit an abstract for consideration and inclusion in the academic programme.
2. Abstracts to be submitted online www.isrrt.org. Faxes will not be accepted.
3. The summary should include objectives, method, results and a conclusion. Conclusions to be supported by data. The summary should be self-contained and understandable. References, tables, figures should not be part of the summary.
4. The Conference Scientific Committee reserves the right to select papers and posters for presentation.
5. Abstracts received will be acknowledged and notification of acceptance or rejection will be by email by **31 October 2007**.
6. The meeting rooms are equipped with data projectors thus only MS PowerPoint will be accepted.
7. Conflict of Interest: If the research is funded (partially or fully) by a proprietary organisation, a statement to that effect must be included at the bottom of the abstract.
8. Please note that no more than three submissions will be allowed per presenter due to possible programme limitations.
9. Please read the submission requirements carefully as submissions will not be changed later. Where possible abstracts will be published as received and the organisers reserve the right to make changes for editing purposes. It is the responsibility of the main author to ensure that submitted abstracts have been edited before submission to minimise errors in the programme.
10. All presenting authors are requested to fully register for the conference by **1 February 2008**. If no registration and payment for ISRRRT 2008 has been received by this deadline, the presentation will not be listed in the programme. This measure has been taken to overcome any "no-shows" disrupting the programme.

Poster Exhibition Presentation

In order to conform with the size of the panels your poster must not exceed 841mm x 1189mm, portrait style.

An A4 copy of the final poster will be required by the organising committee by 1 March 2008. Presenters are advised to make several copies for placement next to the poster. Special A4 plastic sleeves will be provided at the poster boards for the poster copy and business cards.

DRESS CODE

In keeping with the relaxed atmosphere in Durban, the dress code at the congress will be informal. The dress codes for the social functions are as follows:

TRAVEL ARRANGEMENTS



You are responsible for your own travel arrangements and all costs incurred will be for your own account.

Our preferred carrier, South African Airways (SAA), is offering delegates special fares over the period of the event on a first come, first serve basis. These fares are available for flights booked on SAA for the Intercontinental, Regional and Domestic services subject to the relevant class availability. Conditions will apply. Early booking is strongly suggested as flights to, from and within South Africa are generally heavily booked.

TRANSPORT

Transfers from the airport to the hotels are available at a nominal fee. This has to be fully paid by no later than 1 month prior to the conference. All flight details have to be received by this time. Should you require this service please fill in your flight details on the relevant section of the registration form.

A shuttle service will run between the congress hotels and the International Convention Centre for the duration of the congress, as well as between the hotels and social functions. The cost of all shuttle services during the congress is included in the registration fee.

The cost of daily single entry/exit parking at the ICC during the Congress is included in your registration fee. Parking at the ICC during the Gala Dinner will be for your own account.

INTERNATIONAL DELEGATES

Please ensure that you have a minimum of three blank pages in your passport prior to entry into South Africa for immigration purposes. Please also ensure that your passport is valid for a minimum of six months from the date of arrival in South Africa.

Kindly contact your local travel agency to find out if there are any visa requirements to visit South Africa. Travellers entering South Africa from countries where yellow fever is endemic are required to present their World Health Organisation (WHO) vaccination record or other proof of inoculation.



CURRENCY

The currency unit is the Rand, denoted by the symbol R, with 100 cents making up R1 (one Rand). Foreign currency can be exchanged at local banks and Bureaux de Change. There is a bank and ATM at the convention centre. Most major international credit cards such as American Express, Diners Club, MasterCard, Visa and their affiliates are widely accepted. 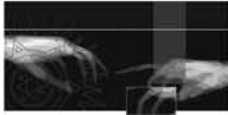
